



FNA REPRESENTATIVE TEAMS – GENERAL POLICIES

FNA Representative Team Player Policy

- To be eligible to be a member of a FNA Representative Team, athletes must be a playing member of a Fremantle Club and participate in that year's current Fremantle Saturday winter competition.
- It is a requirement that all athletes selected into a FNA Representative team complete and sign the FNA Player's code of conduct.
- It is a requirement that the parent or guardian of athletes selected into a FNA Representative team who are under the age of 18 years in the current year complete and sign the FNA Parent's/ Guardian's Code of Conduct.
- It is a requirement that all athletes selected into a FNA Representative team complete and the FNA Medical Profile Form (to be completed by an adult) [This information is treated in confidence and in accordance with the Fremantle Netball Association's Privacy Policy].

FNA Rep. Team Uniform

- The Association provides a full playing uniform for athletes for the carnivals teams participate in and tracksuit to be worn to the Wind-up function.
- This uniform is only to be worn when representing the Association, not to training or at any other time.
- Athletes are required to wear the FNA socks which can be purchased from the Association.
- Athletes are responsible for their own briefs (royal blue) which can be purchased from the Association [please note black are not acceptable].
- Athletes are required to purchase a warm-up/training top and this is to be worn to training and as directed on other occasions.
- Coaches are required to wear the allocated tracksuit and polo shirts to trainings, carnivals and the wind-up function. Shorts are available for purchase to wear during hot weather.
- Team Managers are required to wear the allocated tracksuit and polo shirts to carnivals and the wind-up function. Shorts are available for purchase to wear during hot weather.
- Umpires are required to wear a FNA tracksuit to Association Championships and the wind-up function.

Costs

- FNA Representative Team fees are set annually by the Executive and are based on a "User Pay" system with no fundraising.
- A minimum deposit (as determined annually) is required when collecting the uniform with the balance payable prior to the Association Championships week-end.
- Payment of Fees – a payment plan arrangement can be made with the FNA Rep. Team Co-ordinator.
- Should an athlete's uniform be returned damaged, stained etc. an assessment will be made and an account will be issued from FNA for the appropriate replacement/repair etc. value.
- Should an athlete not return their FNA uniform, they will be ineligible for any future FNA Representative team/s.
- If an athlete withdraws from a team prior to the Association Championships carnival due to injury or illness, a full refund will be made of their Rep. Team fees, excluding the uniform cleaning fee.
- The FNA Player Tea function – no refund will be given if an athlete does not attend.
- The FNA Team Wind-up function - no refund will be given if an athlete does not attend.

General Policies

- Unless agreed to by the Executive only 10 athletes per FNA team will be named, however "train-on athletes" will be named and invited to participate in the training program. "Train-on athletes" participate at no cost unless they are required to join the team when full fees will be payable.
- "Train-on athletes" will participate in the first Coastal Carnival to gain experience and will be provided with a uniform for that carnival (with the uniform to be returned on the night).
- It is the FNA policy that FNA Coaches not coach teams that include their own daughter/s.
- It is the FNA policy that no FNA Rep. Team coaches/managers shall present their team with individual tokens prior to, at or after carnivals.
